Dear Parents,

Following Wednesday's announcement from our Government, Trinity St. Peter's has now closed for many of our pupils today.

Next week, both school and Clubhouse will remain closed until further notice with the exception of children where parents are key workers and vulnerable children. Parents who have requested that their child still attends school next week will receive a confirmation text message by 2 pm tomorrow. Some families have already received their text message. If you do not receive a text message confirming your child's place please do not bring your child to school on Monday.

In the meantime, we will continue to keep you updated with all the latest Government guidance through our whole school blog. We endeavour to continue to provide the very best for our pupils via our class blogs, where class teachers will upload suggested weekly activities for all areas of the curriculum for your child to complete.

During school closure, safeguarding our pupils remains of paramount importance; we all have a duty to ensure our children are safe. Our school website <u>safeguarding</u> page has important information should you have any concerns. If you are worried that a child may be suffering significant harm, neglect or abuse, please follow the advice below from Sefton:

- ·Call 0345 140 0845 (minicom 0151 934 4657) between 8am and 6pm.
- ·Contact the Emergency Duty Team on 0151 934 3555 for urgent advice outside of office hours (from 5.30pm Mon to Thurs, and 4.00pm Friday and weekends)
- ·If you think a child is in immediate danger call for police assistance.

We anticipate some of our children may be spending an increased amount of time online. Our pupils have all received online safety education however to assist you further, there is also a wealth of resources on our online safety section of our website.
