## I visited Nairobi which is the capital city of Kenya.








Outside of big towns and cities, lots of people live in huts made from mud and straw. Here they often do not have electricity or running water.



Lots of people in Kenya live in traditional tribes, as they have done for thousands of years.






## I saw men from the Maasai tribe doing their traditional dance. They jump really high!
