




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


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Titanic: Art Instruction Sheet 3A



Roll a piece of clay into a cylinder about 15cm long and 3cm tall. Flatten the top and bottom. Shape the ends into the bow and stern of the ship.



Roll and flatten another cylinder. It needs to be shorter and narrower. Attach it to the top of the ship using the score and slip technique.



Roll and flatten a final cylinder. It needs to be even shorter and narrower than the previous one. Again, attach it to the top of the ship.



Roll out four small cylinders for the smoke stacks. Cut four pieces of dowelling to roughly twice the length of the clay cylinders.



Carefully push the four pieces of dowelling halfway into the ship. Try to space them evenly apart.



One at a time, gently push the small clay cylinders onto the dowelling. Smooth the clay where the funnel join the ship.



Once the clay is dry, give your ship a coat of grey or white paint.



Begin painting the design you want onto your model. What recognisable features can you include this way?



Leave it to dry. You have now completed your Titanic Model!
