A Successful Start

To help you to support your child in having a smooth transition into Reception in September, we feel the the following information will assist you.

Please also note that a wealth of information, such as <u>school policies</u>, can be found on the <u>school's website</u>.

All children will start school on Monday 4th September at their allocated time. From Tuesday 5th September doors will open from 8:40am till 8:50am





The School Day

In September, school will start promptly each morning at 8.50 am. However, the Key Stage 1 door - situated on the Key Stage 1 playground - will be open from 8.40 am.







The School Day

The school day will finish at 3:05pm. Children should be collected **promptly** from the door pictured below – situated outside the Year 2 classroom - at this time, unless they are attending Clubhouse.







Children are in school for 190 days. This means there are 175 days for holidays etc. The school no longer has holiday forms in operation. Only applications for exceptional leave should be given to the school.

Any child whose absence has been unauthorised for longer than 4.5 days will result in a fine for the parents. This is the Department for Education's policy which the school <u>must</u> adhere to. Ofsted will also ensure the school complies with this.



Attendance

Attendance of 95% for the year equals 10 days that your child has been absent, that is 2 full school weeks of your child's learning missed for that year.

Attendance of 90% for the year equals 19 days that your child has been absent, that is almost 4 school weeks missed.

Attendance of 85% for the year equals 29 days that your child has been absent per, that is almost 6 school weeks missed.

Punctuality matters

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning,

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year
- Arriving 30 minutes late every adds up to 19 days absence a year St. Peter

<u>Uniform</u>

Children are expected to wear the Foundation Stage uniform. It is important that your child's name is clearly marked in all clothing and shoes. It would be very helpful if your child can recognise their name in their clothing.

The school uniform can only be purchased from Whittakers, Southport. This forms part of the school's safeguarding procedures so it is important that all our families abide to this.

Children are able to play outside in all weather so it is really useful if your child can bring an all-in-one waterproof suit and a pair of wellingtons to leave in school. Please practise taking on and off their shoes and putting their own wellingtons on. Please can a spare pair of underwear, t-shirt, jogging bottoms and socks also be provided and kept in their school book bag everyday in case of emergencies.

It would be really helpful if your child could bring a book bag (available from the school office or Whittakers) every day. It is useful when taking home pictures, reading books and water bottles.

In the Summer, their book bag will safely store their sun cream and hat.



Sun Safety

When it is sunny, we encourage children to wear sun hats when playing outside. Please send a name labelled sun hat into school each day for your child.

We also ask you to apply sun cream before your child comes to school on sunny days.


Please also provide your child with a small bottle of sun cream, including a clear name label, to apply themselves during the day.

<u>PE Kit</u>

Children in Reception will access PE time every *Monday* and this will take place in the school hall or outdoor area.

Children will complete PE sessions in their uniform and must wear trainers with *Velcro fastenings only* on this day only.

No extra PE kit is needed.



<u>Homework</u>

There are times when Reception are set 'Talking Homework', which is accessible via Tapestry.

We also encourage you to share any visits, events, celebrations or achievements that your child has taken part in outside of Reception via Tapestry. These can then be added to your child's Learning Journal.



In preparation for September:

Children in Reception eat hot meals and are encouraged to do so by themselves. All children will need to practise the use of cutlery. Children should be competent at using a knife and fork independently.

Please also ensure that your child is able to do the following:

- Take their coat on and off and hang it on their peg;
- Wash and dry their hands;
- Wipe their own bottom after using the toilet;
- Open and close a water bottle;
- Take their shoes on and off;
- Put on their all-in-one waterproof independently.



Reading

As part of the children's Read Write Inc. phonics sessions, the children in Reception will read daily to an adult. During these sessions, adults will support them with their phonetical awareness, pronunciation a decoding skills providing them with feedback. Each week, the ditty / book the child has read in class during these sessions will be sent home to develop their fluency. These books are matched to their phonetical ability. This means that, all being well, your child is able to read the book sent home with confidence. In addition to this, they will also receive an extra 'Book Bag Book' which they will not have read that week, this book will be the same level as their reading book.


Please record in your child's Reading Record Book if they have read at home. The book is for parent use only.
