

## A Successful Start

To help you to support your child in having a smooth transition into Nursery in September, we feel that the following information will assist you.

Please also note that a wealth of information, such as school policies, can be found on the school's website.



On Friday 1st September, all Nursery pupils will be invited into school, to meet staff and visit the classroom. Parents have been informed of their time for their short visit via email.

On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September, Nursery pupils have a staggered start time to ensure a smooth arrival and transition to their first day. Nursery pupils will be invited into school at either 8.45am, 9.00am, 9.15am, 9.30am or 9.45 am. Parents have been informed of their start time on this day via email.

From Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September, Nursery pupils are to arrive from 8.45am (morning session to start at 8.50am).



# The School Day -

Nursery will start promptly each morning at 8.55 am. However, the Nursery main entrance door will be open from 8.45 am each day.







## The School Day:

The Nursery morning session starts at 8.50am and ends at 11.50am. The Nursery door will be open daily from 8.45am until 8.55am

The Nursery afternoon session starts at 12.00 noon and ends at 3.00pm and the Nursery door will be open daily just before 12.00 noon.

Children who do either morning or afternoon sessions should be collected and dropped off promptly by a parent/designated adult via the Nursery Main Entrance door.

If your child is attending Clubhouse, they can be collected from Clubhouse anytime until 6pm.

#### Lunch time

Nursery Lunchtime is from 11.15am. The children will eat a school dinner in the school hall and return to their Nursery classroom / outdoor area for play.

If your child is attending all day or only attending a morning session, they will be able to have a school lunch at a cost of £1.75 per day.

Children who are only attending a morning must be collected at 11.45am and children who are only attending an afternoon session must have eaten their lunch before being dropped off at 12.00noon.



### **Leave of Absence:**

If your child is absent from school, please email the class account or contact the office explaining the reason. If you know in advance that your child will be absent please email the class account or contact the office explaining the reason.



## **Uniform**

Children are expected to wear the Foundation Stage uniform. It is important that your child's name is clearly marked in all clothing and shoes. It would be very helpful if your child can recognise their name in their clothing.

The school uniform can only be purchased from Whittakers, Southport. This forms part of the school's safeguarding procedures so it is important that all our families abide to this.

Children are able to play outside in all weather so it is really useful if your child can bring an all-in-one waterproof suit and a pair of wellingtons to leave in school. Please practise taking on and off their shoes and putting their own wellingtons on. Please can a spare pair of underwear, polo shirt, jogging bottoms and socks also be provided and kept in their school book bag everyday in case of emergencies.

#### **Book Bag**

It would be really helpful if your child could bring a book bag (available from the school office or Whittakers) every day. It is useful when taking home pictures, reading books and water bottles.

Children in the school Nursery will have a 'Belongings Box' that will be used to keep their water bottles, pictures and in the summer their sun cream and hat safe.



#### **Sun Safety**

When it is sunny, we encourage children to wear sun hats when playing outside. Please send a name labelled sun hat into school each day for your child.

We also ask you to apply sun cream before your child comes to school on sunny days.

Please also provide your child with a small bottle of sun cream which is named for them to apply themselves during the day.

## **Homework**

There are times when Nursery is set 'Talking Homework' which is done via Tapestry.

We also encourage you to share any visits, events, celebrations or achievements that your child has taken part in outside of Nursery via Tapestry. These can then be added to your child's Learning Journal.

#### Things to practise over the Summer holidays with your child -

Please ensure that your child is able to do the following:

- Take their coat on and off and hang it on their peg;
- Identify their name with the support of a photograph;
- Wash and dry their hands;
- Get on and off the toilet independently;
- Pull their underwear down to their ankles when needing the toilet;
- Wipe their own bottom after using the toilet;
- Open and close a water bottle;
- Open a sandwich out of foil or cling film and take wrappers off a fruit bar / cake / biscuit or any other items in their lunchbox;
- Use a knife, fork and spoon when eating their dinner;

#### Reading

In the Autumn term, all children will a receive a book from our class library to share at home each week, to develop their love for reading.

In the Summer term the children will receive a discussion reading book, again to share at home.

We encourage parents to share with us comments about their child's reading via their child's reading record book.

Sharing and reading books with your child is one of the most important activities you can do at home:

- An extra 10 minutes, five times per week equals 1800 minutes of reading throughout the school year.
- 20 minutes of reading per day exposes readers to 1.8 million words per year.

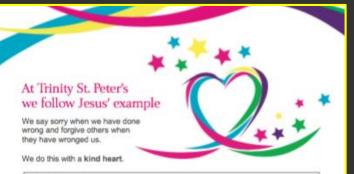
## **Behaviour and Anti Bullying Posters**
