Uniform Policy

For safeguarding purposes, Trinity St. Peter's CE School policy is that all children wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours unless otherwise stated. This includes the school's PE kit.

We ask that all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and is in good repair throughout their time at Trinity St Peter's. Equally, that their child's hair is clean and is appropriately styled for school.

Dependent upon weather, parents may choose to send their child in either Summer or Winter uniform in: the first half term in Autumn, Spring Term 2 (after the February half term) and for the Summer Term.

Children should come to school wearing their PE Kit on their designated PE days and wear their Winter Uniform for Autumn Term 2 (after the October half term) and Spring Term 1 (before February half term).

Children should only bring to school: the school's book bag, a small packed lunch bag and *school PE kit bag when attending an extracurricular club.* On occasions, where children may need to bring a larger bag to school, parents should provide school with the reason for this. Due to the cloakroom and lockers, large bags are not to be brought to school on a daily basis.

Parents of children whose uniform does not comply with school policy will be informed by a member of staff; where compliance is not met it will be referred to the Headteacher or a member of the senior leadership in their absence, and if the family repeatedly do not abide to the policy reported to the school's governing body.

We believe having a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;

• prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;

- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents;
- is designed with health and safety in mind.

The school's uniform consists of:

KS1 & KS2 Winter uniform

Charcoal grey 'V' neck jumper, tank top or cardigan Grey short or long trousers, culottes, skirt or pinafore

White shirt or blouse

'Our' school tie

Charcoal grey socks or tights

Black shoes (not boot style, pumps or trainers)

KS1 & KS2 Summer uniform

Charcoal grey 'V' neck jumper, tank top or cardigan Plain yellow polo shirt or white shirt/blouse with school tie

Yellow and white gingham dress /skorts

Knee length grey shorts, culottes, skirt or pinafore

Charcoal grey or white socks

Black shoes

School's PE kit

Charcoal 'V' neck grey sweat shirt with school logo

Charcoal grey jogging pants

White T shirt or White Polo shirt

Black shorts or skorts

White socks

Black pumps

The school jogging suit top, tie and book bag can only be purchased from Whittakers in Southport or from Team TSP's preloved Uniform shop. All other items can be bought elsewhere.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs in pierced ears. We ask the children to either remove these objects during PE and games, or cover them with a plaster (provided by the parent), to prevent them from causing injury.

Hair

We ask that all children keep their hair neat (shoulder length hair tied back) with no tramlines and/or overstated haircuts or hair accessories as determined by school leaders.

Additional information

Children should not wear nail varnish or make up in school.

Uniform must be labelled.

Parents should always consult with school if a modification to the school's uniform is required for their child's needs.
